#### NEW SOUTH WALES

DON WILSON REPORTED THAT A PROPOSAL FOR A HALF WAY HOUSE THAT HAS BEEN NOTED FOR SOME TIME IN THE GOSFORD AREA IS NOW BEING PERSUED WITH THE INCORPORATION OF THE BRANCH AND WITH AN OFFER OF CO-SPONSOR STATUS FROM THE RSL AND WITH VVCS APPROVAL, IN PRINCIPAL, THEY WERE LOOKING TO THE QUEENSLAND EXPERIENCE FOR GUIDENCE.

#### QUEENSLAND

JOHN THOMPSON REPORTED THAT THEIR HALFWAY HOUSE ' ANGUS HOUSE ' (NAMED AFTER SALLY AND MAL ANGUS ,EX 6RAR , WHO WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE EARLY WORK) IT IS OPEN TO ALL VETERANS , IS FOR EMERGANCY RESIDENTUAL PURPOSES, WITHIN WALKING DISTANCE OF THE VVCS , NEAR GREENSLOPES HOSPITAL , HAS A MAXIMIN RESIDENCY AT THE HOUSE OF 3 MONTHS , AND IS STRICTLY MANAGED TO KEEP THE MANY VETERAN IMPOSED PROBLEMS TO THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEET MONTHLY AND INCLUDE MEMBERS FROM THE VVAA , RSL , DVA , POLICE AND VVCS WITH DIRECT ENQUIRES TO THAT COMMITTEE ONLY. THE GROUP HAS DEVELOPED TRAINING FOR VOLUNTEER HELPERS AND ARE TRYING TO PRODUCE A PART FINANCIAL RESOURCES INCOME. THE RENT ASKED OF RESIDENTS IS \$6 PER WEEK OR \$30 PER WEEK THE BEUROCRATS IN THE DVA DISAGREE THAT WE SHOULD HAVE BEEN GIVEN THE GRANT AND ARE

HOPING THAT WE FAIL SO THEY CAN SAY TO THE MINISTER WE TOLD YOU SO.

#### ACT BRANCH

KEVIN GILL REPORTED THAT THE ACT ARE INVESTIGATING A BLOCK OF LAND THRU THE DEPARTMENT OF CAPITAL TERRITORIES CAPITAL DEVELOPEMENT COMMISSION AND TO BUILD A PURPOSE BUILT HOME OF 10 to 12 ROOMS THIS IS IN THE EARLY STAGES.

#### CON MEN/IMPOSTERS PRESS STATEMENTS

THE COUNCIL DISCUSSED THE PROBLEMS WITH CON MEN WETHER VETERAN OR NOT WHO BRING BAD NAME PROBLEMS TO THE ASSOCIATION AND ALSO THE LAX USE OF THE TERM VIETNAM VETERAN BY THE PRESS.

IT WAS RESOLVED THAT PERSONS ASKING HELP BE GIVEN THE BENIFIT OF THE DOUBT AS WE WOULD NOT LIKE TO TURN A VETERAN AWAY BUT CHECKS CAN BE MADE AND COMPLAINTS TO THE PRESS COUNCIL SHOULD TAKE PLACE.

## AUSTRALIAN VIETNAM WAR VETERANS TRUST FUND ( CLASS ACTION )

DON WILSON GAVE A BRIEF RUN DOWN ON THE CURRENT SITUATION WITH THE TRUST FUND AND DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE CASE IS STILL RUNNING IN COURT THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE TRUST FUND ARE NOT ABLE TO MAKE STATEMENTS, EXCEPT THE FOLLOWING ITEMS OF INFORMATION WHICH ARE COMMON KNOWLEDGE

- (a) A DISPERSAL PLAN HAS BEEN SUBMITTED TO THE JUDGE IN THE US FOR APPROVAL

CONSULTING SCIENTIST : EMINENT SCIENTISTS FROM CANADA, WEST GERMANY AND SWEDEN HAVE REVOKED THEIR EVIDENCE DUE TO THE WAY IT WAS USED BY THE ROYAL COMMISSION

THE NATIONAL OFFICE IS PUTTING ALL THIS EVIDENCE IN, SUB-MISSION FORM AND WILL INCLUDE THE REPLY TO THE REBUTTAL FROM JUDGE EVATT AND NOTE THE ASSOCIATIONS REPLY.

### VETERANS ENTITLEMENT ACT

DISCUSSION WAS HELD ON THE EFFECTS OF THE VEA AND IT WAS EVIDENT THAT THE ACT WAS NOT PERSUED BY THE RSL TO ENSURE THAT THE ENTITLEMENTS OF VETERANS WERE PROTECTED . IT WAS NOTED THAT THE AUSTRALIAN VETERANS and DEFENCE SERVICE COUNCIL (OF WHICH THE VVA IS A MEMBER) HAD FOUGHT THE DVA ALL THE WAY AND BECAUSE THEIR CONCERNS PROVED RIGHT IS GAINING IN MEMBERSHIP TO CONTINUE THE FIGHT.

FOR INSTANCE A VETERAN WAS GIVEN A TPI PENSION UNDER THE RULES OF THE OLD ACT, THE DVA APPEALED TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS TRIBUNAL AND HAD THE PENSION REDUCED TO 100 % UNDER THE RULES OF THE VEA . THE 69 YEAR OLD PENSIONER THEN HAD HIS PENSION LOWERED BY THE DVA TO 30 % SO AS TO GET BACK LEGAL COSTS OF \$47,00 .

THE QUESTION ASKED BY THE COUNCIL IS WHY DID THE RSL ALLOW THIS TO HAPPEN.

It has been brought to our attention by our members in Australia and our associates in the United States that The New Jersey Agent Orange Commission has announced a major scientific breakthrough, the development of a new way to identify toxic substances in the body through simple and inexpensive blood tests.

As your Government has always shown concern for the Vietnam Veteran and has promised to consider any new scientific evidence as it becomes available, we would believe that the required action has already been taken to investigate the feasibility of extending such testing to the repatriation system. Following the press reports many of our members have expressed interest in having such tests. We would greatly appreciate if you could advise if and when such testing for toxic substances within the body will be available to Australian Vietnam Veterans.

Firstly because of the resignation of our National Secretary Ric Haines, and after discussion with Tim McCoombe, Mick Alright(Tas) Kevin Gill(ACT) Fhill Thompson, John Delacca(Ballarat) John Printz(Vic) Grant Collins(SA) Don Wilson(NSW) and myself, by telephone on Wednesday I5th October 1986, the majority view was that it would be prudent to appoint Tim McCoombe as National Secretary/Treasurer as an interim appointment untill our next Council meeting, in November, it was agreed by all except one (NSW) by phone I5th October 86 that it would be appropriate to defer that Council meeting to a later date, to be determined. It was agreed that the deferment not be too long and that it was important to convene a Council meeting as soon as practically possible. (Unfortunately it was not possible to contact QLD on I5/IO/86) The timing for that meeting is at this stage unknown because it is felt we should wait until more info regarding the Royal Commission inquiry is

available.

At this point in time it is known that Justice Evatt has asked the Ministers (DVA) Office to release to him a copy of our submission complaining about his findings. As a result of his request, Tim McCoombe as Secretary/Treasurer, after advise from our legal and scientific advisers, wrote a letter agreeing to let the Judge have a copy of our submission providing he responded within one (I) month and that we got a copy of his comments, and of any other on the copy forwarded to the Judge.

With that in mind the decision at this stage to defer the Council meeting was made in the interests of economy and that it would be wiser to adopt this attitude to allow discussion which may arise from the Judge's response.

Having said all that it's now worth stating that as a result of correspondence received from the NSW State Branch since the telephone conversations (15th Oct) referred to earlier, Phill Thompson is now back in Sydney.

According to the info on the NSW correspondence all State Branches have received copies of that.

For myself I am extremely dissapointed and disgusted with NSW in taking this destructive action, which I assume was taken as a result of the phone calls of the 15th October 1986.

I object to NSW writing (I5th October 86) direct to the Prime Minister regardating blood etc testing, without consulting other States, under the guise of "our members in Australia" thus implying NSW is conducting our National affairs. It is more objectionable though for NSW to write to the Auditor Generals Dept (I3th Oct 86) regarding Royal Commission funding and audited accounts pertaining

- tothat funding. I am aware as will other States delegates at Congress/Council meetings that statements have been tabled (with NSW present) and other financial statements have been forwarded by mail to States at other times. Shown below is a summary of statements held by this State Office;
  - I. Royal Commission Covernment Assistance Acc. (period ending 30/6/85 dated 7/7/85- audited by S. L. Tagga-Co)
  - 2. Inventory of Furniture & Eqpt(dated 5/7/85)
  - 3. Royal Commission Public Appeal Trust Fund Account. (period ending 30/6/85 dated 20/9/85 audited by SL Tagg & Co)

- 4. Same audit document as above put out to States from National Office under cover note 4 of 1986 dated 20/1/86 and sent by mail.
- 5. Tabled at 7th National Congress 3/4 May 86.

  - c. Royal Commission Public Appeal Trust Fund Acc (period end 31/3/86, unaudited)

These documents as presented were accepted by delegates.

May I suggest that if NSW do not hold on file these documents, then perhaps they should look at their own filing system.

The NSW complaint also questions the integrity of our Trustees and auditors, and borders on defamation.

It is my deep hope that other States will support my views and respond in a similair vein.
